REPORT ON

INTERDEPARTMENTAL SEMINAR

Based on the meeting discussion and decision to conduct the Interdepartmental Seminar, the newly inducted Research Committee conducted its first Interdepartmental Seminar on 1st April 2023.

Title of the program: Listen Learn and Grow Together **Date:** 1st April 2023 **Objective:**

To present and discuss on research papers, promote research oriented academic interest among the faculties.

Description: Two Presentations were delivered.

The first topic was, **Historicizing the emergence of 'backward tribe' in a tribal state: A study of Chang Naga tribe. By Ms.** Y Toninaro Chongpho, Assistant Professor & Research Scholar, Department of Sociology.

The presenter talk briefly on the emergence of Tuensang district under 16th Point agreement, also shed light on the formation of 'backward' tribe in the state. Further the demand for Frontier Nagaland by the 7 Eastern tribes were discussed. The roles of DUDA for capacity building of the Eastern Areas was also covered in the topic. The discrimination and insecurities faced by the people of this region was also highlighted. The role of ENPO including the demand for Frontier Nagaland in the present scenario was also highlighted.

Following topic was on, **Parkinson's Disease: Lessons from D**rosophila **Model. By** *Dr. Limamanen Phom*, Assistant Professor, Department of Zoology.

He introduced the neurodegenerative disease Parkinson's disease (PD) as the second most common disease affecting people over the age of 50, the struggles faced by the patient as the disease progress over time was discussed. The presenter further highlighted *Drosophila* model developed to understand the PD pathophysiology. Using herbicides to mimic the disease condition and Curcumin which is mainly found in kitchen spice Turmeric as the therapeutic agent. He summarised that the Curcumin protects dopamine neurons at health stage but fails to protect the neurons during transition stage. Suggesting the limitations of Curcumin as therapeutic agent for late onset neurodegenerative disease such as PD.

Outcome:

The presentations shed light on better understanding of early political development in the state and gradual formation of Backward tribe in the state. Initiative of the government to reach out the Eastern area by launching a dedicated department under DUDA was learnt as a positive approach. However, considering the present state of affairs, whether such initiative is serving its purpose to propel development in the Eastern/Backward areas was yet to be seen.

Developing animal models for human disease may require more basic research focusing on stage specific models. Neurodegeneration is related with aging, also apart from genetic factors, several studies have implicated environmental exposure to pesticides, herbicides and metal ions that hampers the neuronal functions. Therefore, taking the direction into developing stage specific therapeutic approach may serve as worthy investment to address treatment problems related to late onset neurodegenerative disease such as PD.


