


88% of the respondents confirmed that this was the first and only time they answered to this survey whereas only 12% of respondents indicated no.






Out of the 300 respondents, 40% were male and 59.7% were female and 0.3% transgender.




Out of the total respondents, 94% are pursuing Bachelor's degree, 1.3% masters degree, 0.3% M.Phil and 4.3% indicated others.




Out of the total respondents, 96.3% have indicated that they are pursuing Arts at present and 3.7% indicated they are pursuing science.







### 2. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes? 300 responses





### 3. How well were the teachers able to Communicate? 300 responses





### 4. The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as 300 responses





### 5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers 300 responses






7. The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for students 300 responses


8. The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.

300 responses



9. The institution Provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow 300 responses






## 11. Your mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to you 300 responses



38% out of the total respondents have opined usually their mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to them, 26% believed that every time the mentor does a necessary


follow-up with an assigned task to them, 24% as occasionally/sometimes and 12% expressed rarely.

12. The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications. 300 responses



13. The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges. 300 responses






15. The institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process 300 responses


16. The institute/ teachers use student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences.


17. Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities. 300 responses

18. Efforts are made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make you ready for the world of work.


300 responses


19. What percentage of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, Multimedia, etc. while teaching.

Out of the total respondents, 28.3% indicated that 50-69% of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, multimedia etc while teaching, whereas 23% indicated 70-89% teachers use ICT tools in teaching, 14.3% indicated 30-49%, 13% indicated below 29%, 6% indicated 70-89%, 3.3% indicated 30-49%, 2.7% indicated 50-69%, and 1% and 0.7% indicated 30-49% and above 90% in this use of ICT by teachers respectively.

20. The overall quality of teaching-learning process in your institute is very good. 300 responses



60.7% of the respondents agreed that the overall quality of teaching-learning process in the institute is very good, whereas 20% were neutral, but 16.3% of the respondents strongly agreed in the over quality of teaching and learning process and 2% and 0.7% of the respondents indicated disagree and strongly disagree respectively.
