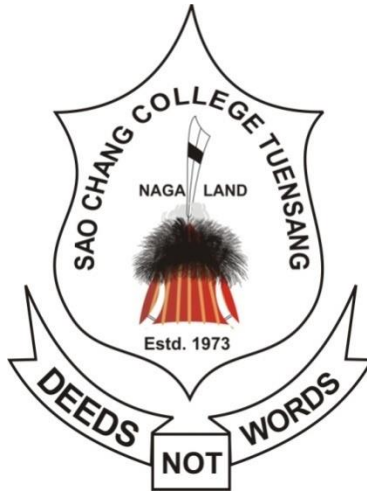

COLLEGE PROFILE

Sao Chang College, earlier called Tuensang College, was named after Late Sao Chang, the former Minister for Transport & Communication and PHED, Government of Nagaland. The cherished aspiration for higher education of the people saw its light with a humble beginning as 'Night College '(Arts) in 1973 at a designated temporary building at Tuensang town. To accommodate the increasing enrolment of students seeking for higher education within the District, the college was elevated to a regular day-shift college. The college was taken over by the Government of Nagaland in April 1983. In its march towards a greater horizon, the degree level of science stream was introduced in 2005.

Shifted in the year 1996, the college now has its own permanent campus at a distance of about 9 Kilometres away from the town. Located amidst splendid and lofty mountain ranges and a pervading atmosphere of serenity, the college is ideal and conducive to be a centre of higher learning.

The college is co-educational. It imparts education in Arts and Science stream at the degree level. It is affiliated to the Nagaland University.

VISION

To provide opportunities for higher learning so as to produce useful and responsible citizens of the country, that they may bring social, economic and educational development in the country. All these can be visualized through total personality development of the student by imparting quality education under the college motto **‘Deeds Not words’**

MISSION

To educate young student and prepare them to transcend in the service of the country and to attain personal fulfilment by leading a value based life through innovative and student friendly curriculum.

OBJECTIVE

1. To provide quality higher education for developing innate potentials of the students.
2. To impart life-long value education.
3. To inculcate the spirit of competitiveness in the students.
4. To identify and assist in making students prospective individuals in the society

BROAD FRAMEWORK OF RULES UNDER SEMESTER SYSTEM

1. A minimum of 80% attendance in the class shall be the basis to declare a student eligible to fill up the form and appear in the End Term examination. Relaxation may be considered in case of genuine reasons.
2. A deficit in the required percentage of attendance may disqualify a student for award of scholarship.
3. Out of 100 marks in each paper, 30 marks shall be exclusively set aside for internal assessment and 70 marks for the End Term Examination.
4. A student must secure at least 45% marks in each theory paper in the internal examination as well as external Examination in order to be declared passed. For Science stream, in a given Practical paper, a student should secure a minimum of 55% marks to be considered passed.
5. No student shall be allowed to appear in the End Term Examination unless he/she secures 45% in the Internal Assessment in Theory Paper. A failed student in the internal Assessment shall not be eligible to fill up the form for the End Term Examination.
6. Students are advised to consult the competent authority of the college for further details of the rules and criteria, if needed be.
7. Eligibility norms for admission to the B.A and the B.Sc shall be regulated in compliance with the rules framed by the college from time to time.

DEGREE COURSE

The semester system for undergraduate course spreads over 3 years period and splits into 6 Semesters.

Note:

1. It is compulsory to opt for 3 subjects from the total Elective Subjects offered.
2. Honours' course is offered in English, Political Science, History, Sociology, Education and Economics. A student can opt for honours' in any of the mentioned subjects provided a minimum of 45% has been secured in the concerned subject at the HSSLC or equivalent level.
3. To opt for Honours' subject, a student must apply separately to the concerned Head of Department along with an attested copy of the mark sheet.
4. The permission to opt for Honours may, however, be subject to the screening test if deemed necessary by the concerned Department of the college.
5. Any student can opt for Certified Vocational Course in Floriculture depending on the availability of seats.

EXTRA CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

National Cadet Corps

The college has an active NCC unit with designated Officer –in-Charge who oversees its activities governed under Government policy. Students are encouraged to be enrolled depending on the availability of requisite quota. Cadets may appear for the ‘B’ and ‘C’ certificate examination after completion of prescribed trainings which will provide them advantages during selection to Military Service.

National Service Scheme

The NSS is an Indian Government sponsored public service programme aimed at developing students’ personality through community service. The college has NSS unit with a designated Programme Officer who supervises and conducts regular activities with the volunteers both within and outside the college. The programme inculcates a sense of duty amongst the students’ towards community service.

Games And Sports

Keeping in mind the indispensable contribution of games and sports towards the wholesome development of an individual, the college encourages active participation in the sporting events that it organizes annually.

Literary And Related Activities

For all round development and training of students, the college organizes co-curricular activities such as debate, extempore speech, quiz, essay writing, seminars, publication of annual students' magazine and exposure to lectures from visiting resource persons.

Evangelical Union

The Evangelical Union Sao Chang College organizes programmes such as Retreats, Bible studies, Youth Camps, Prayer Meetings, Fellowships etc. It is a student ministry working under the banner of Union of Evangelical Students of India (U.E.S.I). The U.E.S.I is a student movement that links colleges, universities and Evangelical Unions throughout the Indian subcontinent. The College E.U conducts morning assembly twice a month on second and fourth Wednesdays.

Students' Union

In order to provide students a scope to develop their latent talents in decision making as well as to represent the aspirations of the student community, the college has a Students' Union which is regulated by the constitution set by the competent authority i.e. the Principal and the 'Election Commission' of the college. Sao Chang College Students' Union has an Executive body consisting of Principal as President (Ex-Officio), a General Secretary and other office bearers.

OTHER FEATURES

NAAC

The college is well aware of the importance of quality education. As mandated by the government, the college had instituted an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) which is headed by the Principal who has taken up the task of ensuring quality education by way of facilitating the conduct of all NAAC related activities like workshops, seminars, mentorship, career guidance, remedial coaching, research etc,. Under the tireless efforts and vision of the college management, faculty members, students and all stakeholders, Sao Chang college has begun its humble journey of its 1st cycle of accreditation and has been accredited as grade 'c' by the NAAC in the month of May 2020. Despite its numerous hurdles and challenges, the college is continuing on toward achieving its goal in equipping young minds with the best possible education and thereby realize their best potentialities.

Academic Excellence Award

With a view to encourage students the academic Excellence award (AEA) is awarded to students for achieving excellence in their academics. Every year two toppers (one each from Arts and science stream) are given an award of ₹. 5000/- each along with certificates. The A.E.A. is sponsored by Lt. P. Chuba Chang, Ex-minister and family, and by Lt. Aoyongdang Chang, Noksen village.

Award For University Topper

The University topper award is being sponsored by the family of Lt. Tspongse Sangtam . This award carries a cash prize of ₹. 5000/- as well as a certificate of merit.

Student Of The Year Award

After every Academic year comes to a close, an outstanding student who excels himself/herself in all fields is honoured with the 'student of the year' award. The award is instituted by the Faculty whereby a 'memento' and a 'certificate of merit' is given to the awardee.

Best Debater Award (BDA)

Another scheme of award, “Best debater of the year Award” has been introduced in the college. The winner of the debate, conducted by the college, receives a cash award of ₹. 1000/- and a certificate. The award is being sponsored by the family of Lt. Chiten Sangtam.

Study Tour

To comprehend better the geographical, geological and environmental resources of the nation, study tours play a vital role. It creates the desire for investigation, exploration, discovery and conservation of the natural resources. To supplement theoretical learning, the College organizes and conducts study tour every year. Selected students are exposed to distant or nearby spots (villages) for gathering first hand information and experiences. Moreover, depending on the availability of funds, the college organizes Excursion for students.

Computer Lab

Basic skill set for using computer is an essential part of educational system. As such, the college has a computer lab with an intake capacity of 15 seats to provide training to teachers, students and ministerial staff.

Library

The library being the fountain head from which stream of knowledge flow, the college has a well equipped library that is constantly updated with books, journals, magazines and newspapers. A student may borrow books for 7 days with a provision for renewal not exceeding one month. Xerox facility is also available to assist students

Mentoring

Mentoring is a three year integrated programme for all the students admitted in the college. The main objective of this programme is to ensure a ‘sound mind in a healthy body’ by providing personal mentoring sessions so that they are able to overcome concerns faced by them in both academic as well as non-academic issues. Each student will be assigned under a particular teacher as his or her mentor and will be counselled during the entire tenure of the college.

Bus Service

The college provides bus service to commute students and staff between the college and the town. Appropriate fee is charged for maintenance of the College Buses.

Hostel Facility

Sao Chang College has a Hostel for both boys and girls ideally located in a congenial atmosphere. It began in 2017 with a humble beginning provided through donations contributed by the faculty and well-wishers. It has an intake capacity of 30 seats each. All the hostel rooms are two-bedded. Admissions to the hostels are done on first come basis. There is no reservation quota as such except that special considerations may be looked into for students with disabilities. Both the hostel has a warden to supervise the daily activities of the hostellers. The overall management of the hostel is monitored by the Hostel Committee comprising of select Faculty. The Hostels conducts prayer fellowships, literary activities, and other such activities periodically.

Gymnasium Cum T.T Hall

Besides the College Multipurpose Hall, a Gymnasium cum T.T Hall is been instituted from the year 2018. Students can make use of these facilities as per schedules fixed for recreational activities.

RUSA

Under the comprehensive initiative of the Rashtriya Uchchattar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA) which is a Government of India sponsored scheme under MHRD, the college has instituted a Certified Vocational Course in Floriculture since 2016. Students are encouraged to take admission for the course depending on the availability of seats. This venture seeks to equip students in honing their entrepreneurial skills alongside their regular academic programme

ADMISSION NORMS

1. For taking up of honours paper, student must have secured a minimum of 45% marks in the concern subject in HSSLC/Class 12 standard examination.
 2. Students those who wish to take up honours paper has to submit a separate application to the concern department at the time of admission. However, the final selection of students for honours paper shall be done by the concerned subject department.
 3. Elective English will be compulsory for students opting English Honours
 4. Documents required during admission:

- Original documents should be produced at the time of admission along with the filled-in admission form.

Library Rules and Regulations

1. **Library working hours:** 9:00 AM to 4:00 PM (Monday to Saturday). The library will remain closed on 2nd and 4th Saturday and also on holidays.
2. **Eligibility:**
College Library is open for the following categories of users:
 - Students of Sao Chang College.
 - Faculty and Staff of Sao Chang College.
 - Visitors (allowed only to read)
3. **Conditions for borrowing books:**
 - a. All books issued for reading must be returned or renewed on or before expiry of the due date.
 - b. If the books are not returned or renewed, overdue charges will be imposed.
4. **Duration of loan and overdue charges:**

5. **Loss of Library Card:** If any student loses his/her library card, it should be immediately reported to Librarian for replacement upon making a payment of Rs.150.
6. **Loss of Books:**
 - a. Loss of books issued should be reported to the Librarian immediately.
 - b. Loss of library book should be replaced by the borrower (with the same book).
 - c. If the borrower is unable to replace the lost book, current price of the particular book shall be paid by the defaulter.

7. **Reference and periodical Section:** Reference books, rare books and unbounded periodical will not be issued. However they shall be made available only for reading in the library.
8. **General Library Etiquette:**
- All users of the library are requested to produce library card, if required.
 - Library card is not transferable.
 - Renewal of the same book at a stretch shall be allowed only once.
 - All users and the library staff are requested to observe complete silence inside the library.
 - No user shall deface the library books by tearing, marking, scribbling notes etc.
 - Borrowers are instructed to check the books at the time of borrowing. It shall be the sole responsibility of the borrower if any damages or mutilations are detected and shall be penalized accordingly.
 - Except for notebooks and writing materials, no other personal belongings will be allowed inside the library.
 - Edible are not allowed inside the Library.
 - Mark sheets of the library defaulters will be withheld until they obtain no due certificate from the Librarian.
9. **Violation by users:**
- Users found violating any of the library rules will be reported to the competent authority for necessary action.
 - Notwithstanding anything contained in these rules, the decision of the competent authority in library matters shall be final and binding on all users.
