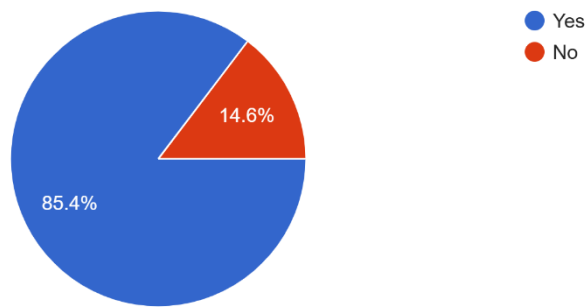

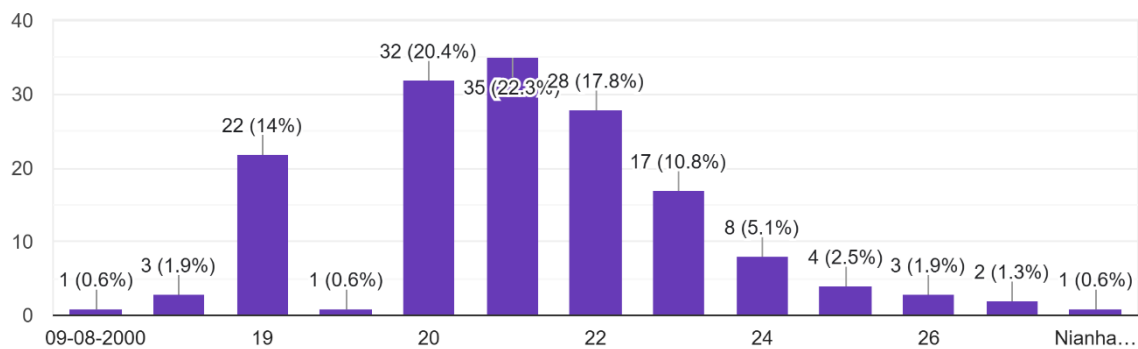

Out of the total respondents, 85.4% were first and only time to answer to this survey whereas, 14.6% were not first and only time to respond to this survey.

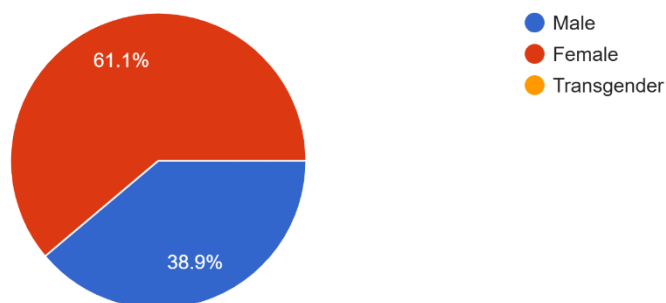

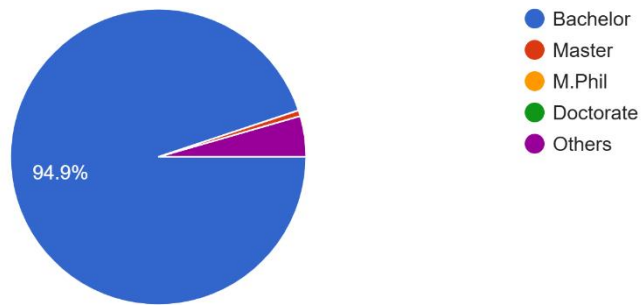

What degree program are you pursuing now?

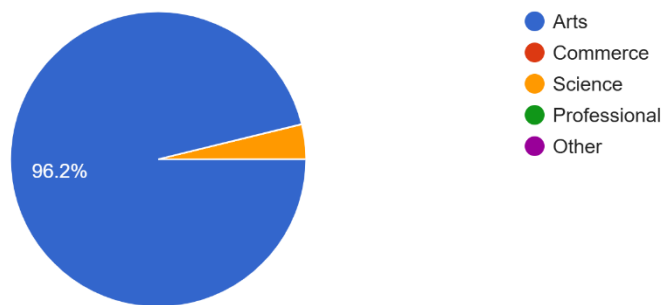

96.2 of the respondents are currently pursuing arts where as 3.8% of the respondents are currently pursuing science.

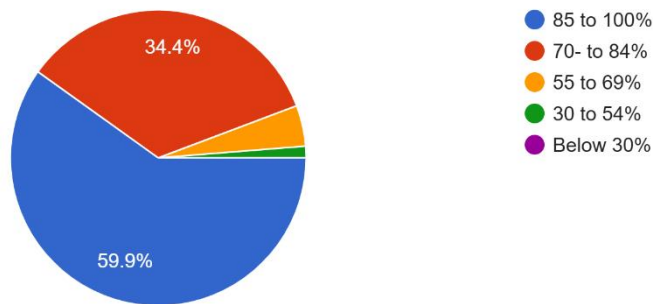
Criterion II - Teaching-Learning and Evaluation

1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?

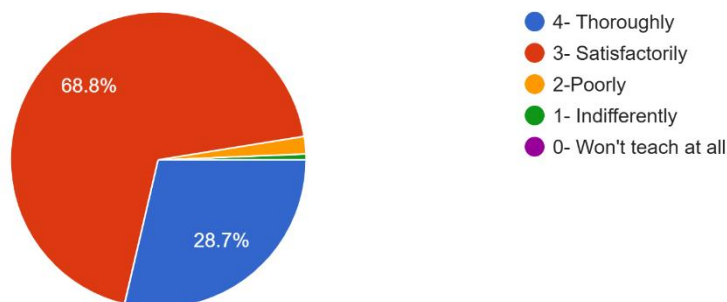

Out of the total respondents, 59.9% indicated that syllabus was covered between 85-100%, 34.4% indicated that syllabus was covered between 70-84%, 4.5% indicated between 55-69% and 1.3% indicated between 30-54%.

2. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes?

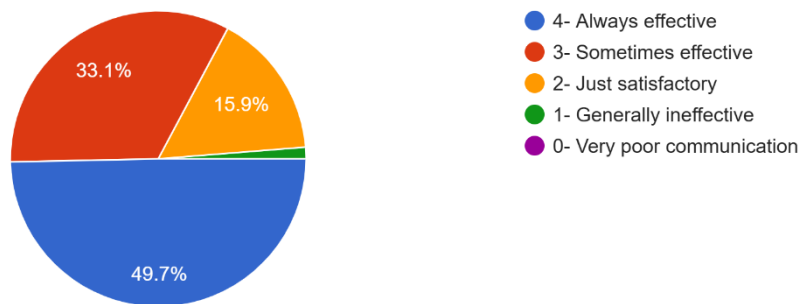

68.8% indicated that teachers prepare for classes satisfactorily, 28.7% indicated teacher prepare for classes thoroughly, 1.9% teachers prepare classes poorly and 0.6% indicated indifferently.

3. How well were the teachers able to Communicate?

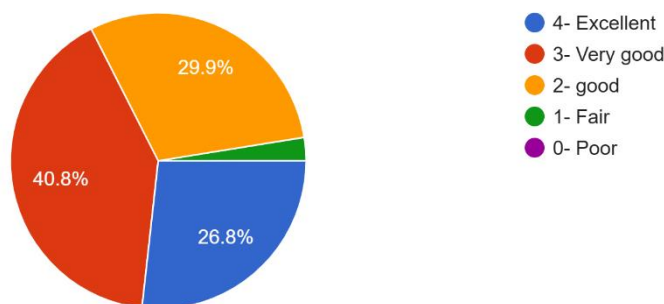

4. The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as

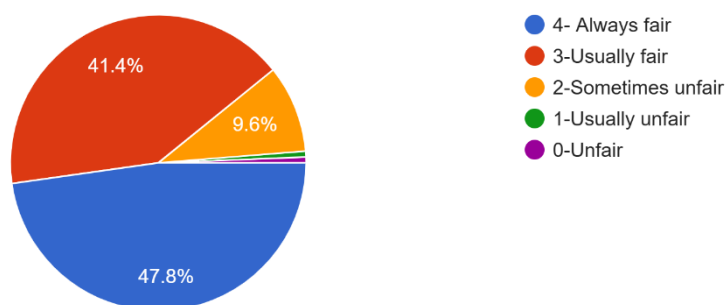

5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers

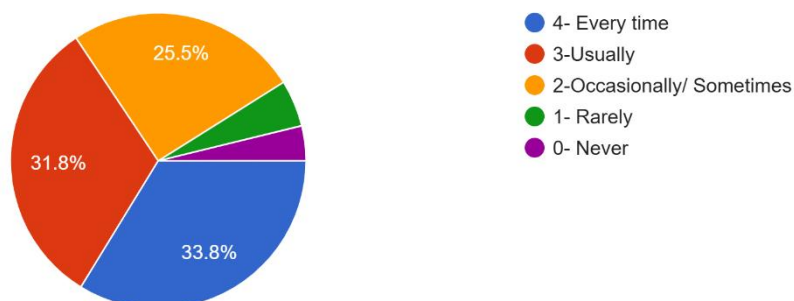

6. Was your performance in assignments discussed with you?

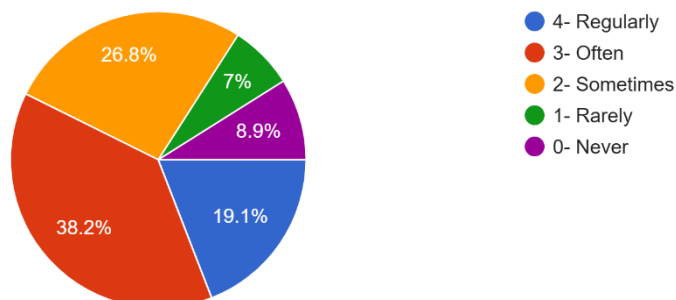

7. The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for students

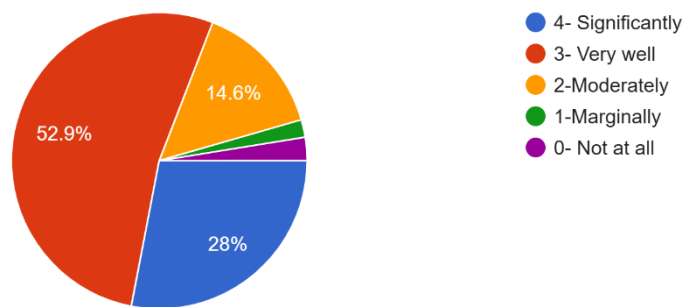

8. The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.

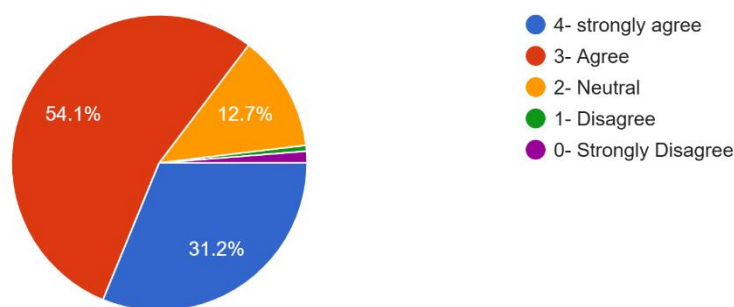

9. The institution Provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow

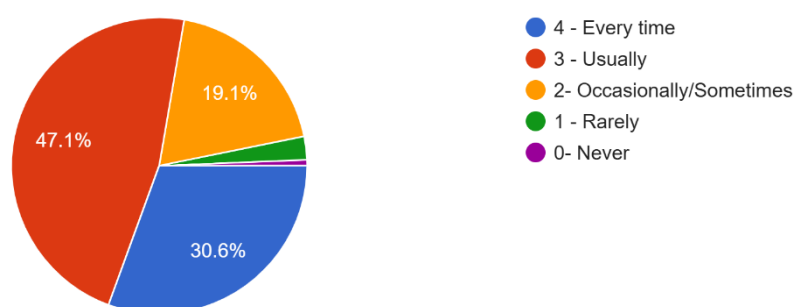

10. Teachers inform you about your expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes

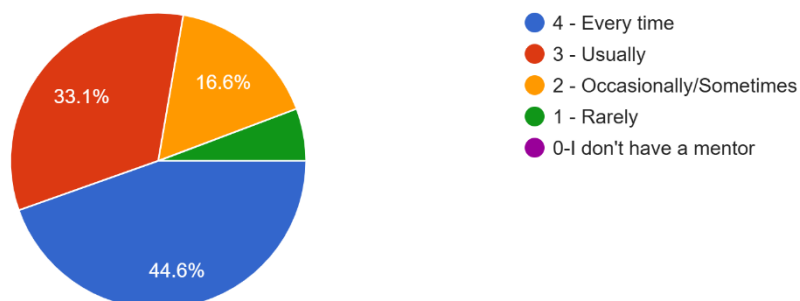
157 responses



30.6% indicated that every time the teachers inform them about their expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes, 47.1% indicated usually the teachers inform them about their expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes whereas 19.1% indicated occasionally and 2.5% and 0.6% of the responded rarely and never respectively.

11. Your mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to you

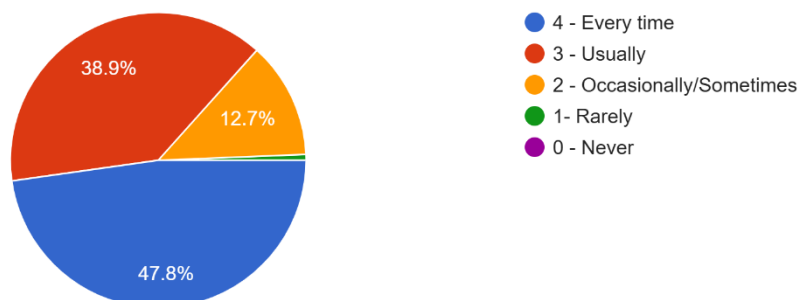

12. The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications.

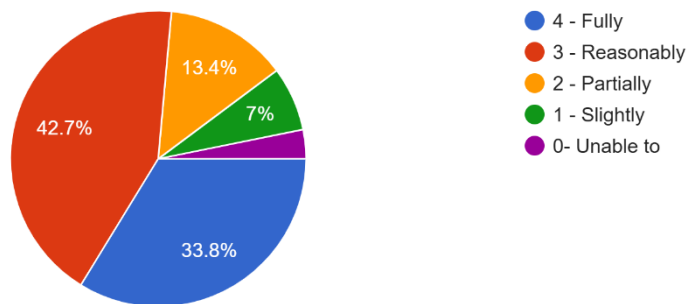

13. The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges.

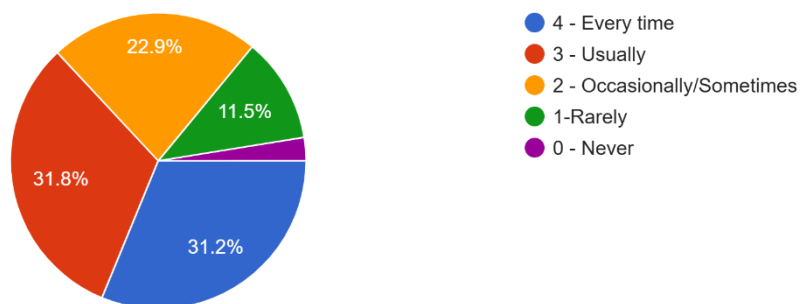

14. Teachers are able to identify your weaknesses and help you to overcome them

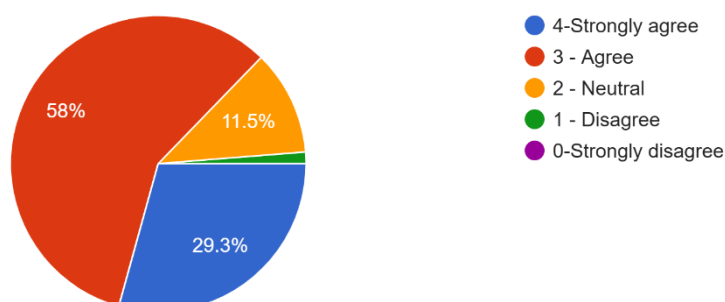

15. The institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process

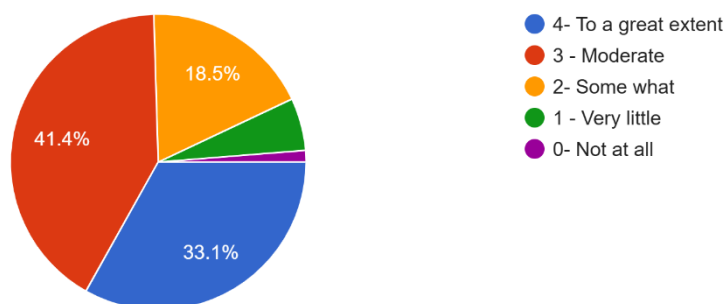

16. The institute/ teachers use student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences.

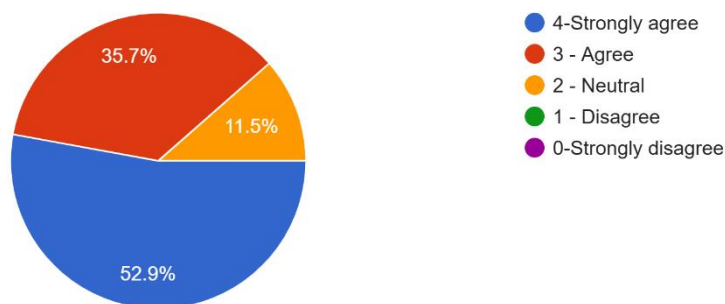

17. Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities.

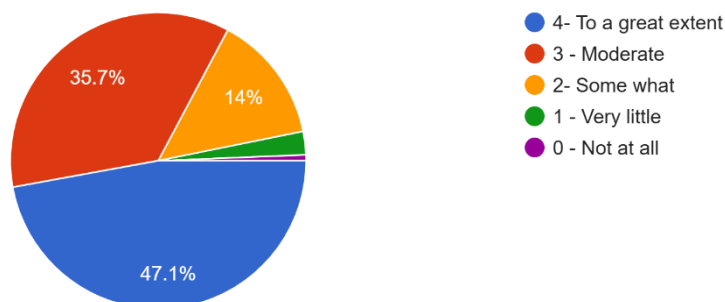

18. Efforts are made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make you ready for the world of work.

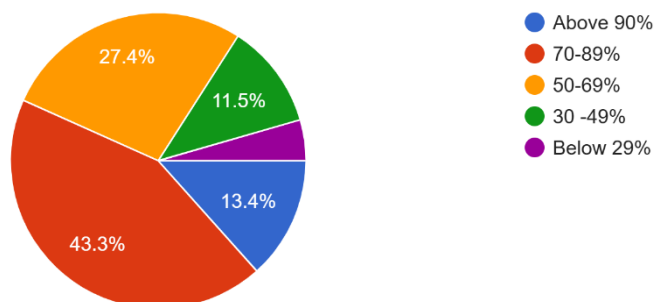

19. What percentage of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, Multimedia, etc. while teaching.

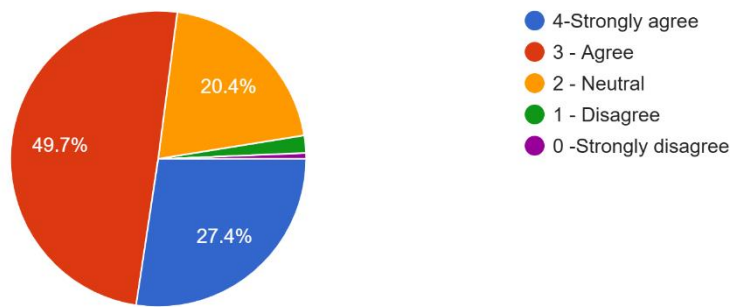

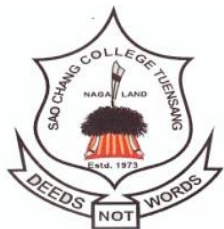

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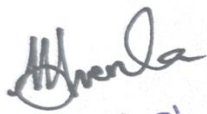
