On WISDOM and HUMANITY of the NAGAS

The Naga people's culture is deeply rooted in strong moral principles. To live a long and harmonious life, it is essential to follow certain customs and beliefs. For example, one should avoid stealing, committing adultery, lying, and bearing false witness. Charles Chasie (2005) explains that certain Angami words, such as kenyü (taboo), mhosho (integrity, honor), menga (shame), terhomia (supernatural), and peyü (wisdom), represent values that shape the psyche of all Nagas.

Robert Fulghum's (2003) famous essay "All I Need to Know I Learned in Kindergarten" reminds me of the Naga people's cultural values. In the essay, Fulghum suggests that the world would be a better place if adults followed the simple rules they learned in kindergarten as children:

Share everything.

Play fair.

Don't hit people.

Put things back where you found them. Clean up your own mess.

Don't take things that aren't yours.

Say you're sorry when you hurt somebody.

Wash your hands before you eat.

Flush.

Warm cookies and cold milk are good for you.

Live a balanced life—learn some and think some and draw and paint and sing and dance and play and work every day some.

Take a nap every afternoon.

When you go out into the world, watch out for traffic, hold hands, and stick together.

GARDENING, FOOD PROCESSING, AND WORK AND EARN PROGRAMME INITIATIVES AT SCC SOCHUM

In a bid to promote sustainability, entrepreneurship, and practical skill development, the students and faculty members of SCC Sochum have spearheaded several initiatives over the past month.

GARDENING INITIATIVE: \

Commencing on March 15, 2024, the gardening project aimed to cultivate organic fruits and vegetables to enhance the availability of healthy food options within the community. Over a span of two weeks, students actively participated, contributing a variety of seeds including beans, mustard, cucumber, melons, pumpkin, radishes, garlic, squash, and other greens. The initiative not only seeks to produce fresh produce but also fosters a culture of environmental stewardship by promoting greenery in the area.

FOOD PROCESSING PROGRAMME:

Concurrently, a Food Processing Programme was organized at the Nagaland Tool Room and Training Center from March 22 to March 27, 2024. Both male and female students engaged in baking classes instructed by professional baker Miss Cham Khiamniungan. The comprehensive curriculum covered cake baking, cookie, custard, jam making, wine, pickle, and candy making. Each session commenced with theoretical insights into ingredient functions, baking principles, and safety precautions, followed by practical demonstrations allowing students to observe and learn baking techniques firsthand.

WORK AND EARN PROGRAMME:

On March 15, 2024, the Hostel Management Committee launched the Work and Earn Programme, offering students opportunities to gain practical work experience and generate income to support their academic pursuits. Twenty-four students were divided into two groups. One group focused on crocheting, enabling individuals to craft various items from accessories to home decor. The other group was tasked with producing edible items such as cookies, cakes, bread, candies, jams, and pickles. Dr. Lanurenla, the Principal of SCC and the Chairman of Hostel Management Committee pledged to establish a stall to exhibit and sell the products crafted by the students. The Work and Earn Programme not only empowers students economically but also equips them with valuable life skills and entrepreneurial acumen.

These initiatives underscore SCC Sochum's commitment to holistic education, boost self-reliance, and contributing to the sustainable development of the community. Along with the mentioned activities, the Sochum conducts other activities to enhance the over all development of the Sochumers.

WHAT IS EU AND IT'S HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

A friday evening in 1949, some college students met and prayed at 190, Poonamallee High Road, Chennai(then Madras), the home of Professor Hannington Enoch. Week after week they met. Little did the group or Prof. Enoch imagine that this group would grow into a national student movement.

That little prayer cell became the powerhouse of ministry among the students. On 18th September, 1945, after a full discussion, it was decided to adopt the name Union of Evangelical Students of India (UESI). The main reason was to distinguish this ministry from other student movements in India and to underline the indigenous nature of the movement.

UESI was born out of God-given vision and continuous prayers. What began as one tiny seed has now myriad shoots like the banyan tree. After which the Evangelical Union (EU) branched out under the banner of UESI in order to function the ministry at the grassroots level. In the accepted institutions all over India it aims to nurture the students by the transformed student members so that they may serve the nation as the disciple of Lord Jesus Christ.

UESI was affiliated to International Fellowship of Evangelical Students(IFES). In India under the UESI there are three groups divided according to the degree level of the students. EU, ICEU, and EGF. Student can join EU after only they clear matriculation, they remain as an EU member untill they graduate. Right after the graduation the EU students will automatically become a member of EGF which is Evangelical Graduate Fellowship. ICEU means Inter-collegiate Evangelical Union. To serve as ICEU, a member has to be inducted from the recent graduated students.

History of EU SCC

In SAO CHANG COLLEGE, EU was established on April 27,2003 and was affiliated to UESI in the year 2014 on March 25. The EU Ministry in SCC is growing rapidly in terms of its members in number as well as spiritually. The EU acts as a guide to help students who are lost and confused when it comes to faith. The weekly fellowships and camps provide a space for the members to express their opinions, share experiences and their interactions inspire each other. Extending community services exposes the students on the importances of team work, values of life, leadership qualities and personality development. It also bridges the gap between the teachers and students in terms of communication. Which could even more change the life of a student into a better person.




